April 8, 2024

EARLY BIRD ERRANDS: Beat the eclipse-induced rush! Schedule your errands and appointments before Friday the 5th. Plan accordingly for Monday the 8th, as some services might have limited hours or closures. Let's be proactive and help our local businesses restock before the eclipse visitors flood in.

SUPPLY STOCK-UP: Expect high demand and potential shortages. If there's something you need, grab it early! Let's avoid the last-minute scramble and make sure everyone gets what they need.

FUEL UP: If your usual gas day falls on Sunday-Monday, get it done before Saturday, April 6th. Don't let the eclipse traffic catch you with an empty tank!

CASH CONSIDERATION: If you're a cash user, swing by the bank or ATM before Saturday, April 6th. It's always good to have some on hand, especially during busy times.

COMMUNICATION PLAN: With an influx of visitors, cellular service may be strained. Develop a communication plan with friends and family, and know your neighbors with landlines just in case. 911 & HEALTH REMINDERS: Save 911 for true emergencies. Have your local dispatch non-emergency number handy. And for all you aspiring food entrepreneurs, make sure you've got the proper permits from the Iron County Health Department
